BREED SURVEY REGISTRAR'S REPORT 1.7.21 - 30.6.22

The financial year 2021/22 has seen the return of near normality when compared to the disruption of the previous two years.

Disappointingly, this has not translated to an increase in the number of animals utilising the GSDCA schemes, despite a small increase in the number of puppy registrations over the same period, based on Dogs West registrations.

Six breed surveys have been conducted in the Year 1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022. A total of 12 of 13 presented were successfully surveyed in the period. Of the 13 animals presented to survey, 3 were Stock Coat males, 1 Long Stock Coat male, 7 Stock Coat females, 2 Long Stock Coat females.

Congratulations to all of the owners and breeders of the 12 animals successfully surveyed in 2021.

A big thank you to all of the members who have applied to survey their dogs for ensuring that the paperwork has been completed correctly and submitted on time. For the most part, those members who are presenting their dogs to survey, the photographs of the dogs are also being submitted in a timely manner. Thank you.

We have been very fortunate with the weather this year with the nasty weather holding off at least until the surveys have been completed. Barring any disruptions to the calendar, we have three more surveys planned for the 2022 calendar year. Stay warm and enjoy your dogs!! Sadly, the statistics show a somewhat disturbing picture. 2020 had 26 animals successfully classified, which dropped to 16 in 2021. This could possibly be attributed to COVID, despite the numbers of animals being bred in the past couple of years not having decreased.

Alarmingly, the number of animals surveyed in the year ended June 2022 was exactly half of that surveyed in 2020. In all years the number of females classified was significantly more than males. The % difference between males and females surveyed in the 4 years ending 2018 – 2021 is > 50% more females being surveyed than males. The greatest difference in the years mentioned (2018-2021) between males and females being successfully surveyed is in the year ended 2021, however, the total number of surveyed animals in 2022 was only 80% of the previous year.

OUR RESCUE GROUP - SAFE (PERTH)



A little about our organisation -

SAFE Perth is a not for profit organisation which aims to rescue and rehabilitate the unwanted and abandoned animals of Western Australia. We are a no kill organisation and we rescue dogs, cats, horses, rabbits, mice, rats, sheep, goats, horses and any other animals requiring our assistance. Over the years we have rehabilitated and re-homed a large number of German Shepherds. We currently have several in our care.

Our adoption process is stringent to ensure our animals go to the right home. This process involves an initial phone interview with Suzanne Campbell followed by a meet with the animal, if the meet is successful then a home check where one of our volunteers attends the proposed home for one of our dogs and checks that the environment is suitable as well as checking boundaries to ensure security.

If the abovementioned steps are successful then an adoption agreement is signed.


We believe this agreement to safeguard each of our animals' best interests. We have a strict adoption policy which stipulates that if for any reason a SAFE Perth animal cannot be kept, then that animal must return to our care so that we can ensure safe and responsible rehoming. It is also a requirement of our adoption agreement that adopted animals are registered with the local council.

We also require that we are left as secondary contact on the animal's microchip so that if an owner cannot be contacted then there is a safeguard in place for the animal. Our foster carers also go through a very similar process to ensure that they are suitable including home checks.

All SAFE Perth animals are vet-checked, de-sexed, microchipped and vaccinated prior to adoption to ensure that they are of optimal health and to ensure that our animals live happy, healthy lives.
