About a year ago I put together a grounds working party to look after the grounds and as we still don't have a ground manager we are still reliant on the members of the ground working party helping out on the ground. I would hope that this working party would continue to function in the event that we are lucky enough to get someone to stand for the position of Ground Manager. My thanks go to John Crace, Dorothy Marr, Angela Boeyinga, Ian Heard, Iain McIntosh, Kym Glenny & Kerrie Pearce who all help out in their own way. I thank you all for helping us to keep the grounds looking as good as they do at the moment.

I would also like to thank Margaret Adams and her band of helpers who come in and clean the canteen, clubrooms and toilets as required. Thanks guys, you know that your help is always appreciated by me.

As always we have had some expenses in keeping up with the maintenance of the club rooms and grounds. We are very fortunate to own our own grounds but this comes with extra costs which we always have to be mindful of whenever we need to action any problem that may occur from time to time.

There are a couple of issues that we have to deal with which have been ongoing problems for many years now and don't seem to be improving despite many requests for members to do as we ask.

I refer of course to once again having to comment on the number of times some of our members leave dogs faeces on the ground for someone else to pick up. This is without doubt the most frustrating and annoying problem within our club. This irresponsible behaviour is totally unacceptable and needs to stop.

If you bring your dogs onto the club grounds during the week to let them have a run off lead then you need to be aware of where they are and whether or not they have done a toilet while off lead. We are so lucky to own our own grounds and with that comes the responsibility of us all to take pride in what we have and PICK UP after our dogs. This also includes the members that utilise the Greyhound straight track.

The other issue is the matter of smokers dropping their cigarette butts on the grounds which is dangerous to our dogs, particularly the puppies. I have asked for this to stop on so many occasions with little or no success therefore we have decided to adopt the same system that is in place at the Dogswest grounds and create two smoking zones on the grounds. These two zones will be the only places where smoking will be allowed on the grounds. We hope to eventually put a roof over the zone near the clubrooms for the times that it is raining and until this occurs then the green shed near that particular zone can be used. I would emphasise that this shed is only to be used when it is raining. I regret having to bring in this rule but asking people to stop dropping the butts on the grounds hasn't worked.

I take this opportunity to reiterate the times and places that we are allowed to fire the starting pistol on our grounds:-

- a) It should **only** be fired at the gate end of the grounds.
- b) It can be fired each Sunday at training, at all Breed Surveys and during the State Breed Exhibition, always at the gate end of the grounds.
- c) It cannot be fired earlier than 1 hour after dawn (Preferably not before 9.00am) and no later than 1 hour before dusk (preferably not after 5.00 pm)

We need to always consider the impact on our neighbours and how it would impact on us with regards to Breed Surveys and the running of the open classes during the State Breed Exhibition if Gosnell Council refused permission for us to fire the gun.

Our membership numbers are holding very steady and we currently have about 454 members which is very close to last year's figures. These are great numbers in comparison to the membership numbers of three years ago when we were down to about 380 members. I believe that the four free lesson certificates are the main reason for the continuing steady numbers plus the great work being done by our obedience instructors.

The numbers at training every Sunday are up around 80 and each class now has large numbers including the older classes where we used to lose them. I encourage all our breeders to give out these certificates or at the very least encourage all of your puppy buyers to join the club and we will supply the certificate to them.

We have had a much better year in regards to ground maintenance matters with no major issues other than some reticulation problems again. This has now been fixed and is working well again as can be seen by the great condition of the grounds. We replaced the cisterns in the Ladies toilet due to the old cisterns being too small, and all seems to be OK again now, thanks to Steve Adams for changing the cisterns for us. We had to replace the old chest freezer in the canteen and we were able to obtain a new one from Masters at a reasonable price. I offer my thanks to John Crace for arranging to replace the old freezer. It is now installed and working well. We have finally been able to get rid of the pile of rubbish that has built up over a period of time near the Agility equipment shed. My thanks to all the members that came down on Friday the 8th July to help throw all the rubbish into the skip that we hired. Well done Guys and thank you so much.

Once again we had a group of members making the long trek to the National Show and Obedience Trial which was held in Sydney during the Easter Week-end. The numbers from WA were down on the usual number of members attending the National Show & Obedience Show and this was, without doubt, caused by the Dog League persisting in holding the National over the Easter Week-end which adds greatly to the already costly exercise of getting their dogs to the National along with the extra costs of flights, accommodation and hiring vehicles during a public holiday week-end. Our members did very well again.

We had the Gold Medal Dog with Penny Alders Labo vom Schollweiher (Deu) a ED and the Bronze Medal Bitch with Robyn's Pedra Deglia Achai (Italy) a ED, congratulations and well done to you both and well done to all who attended.

Your commitment to supporting these Nationals and your ability to continually overcome the Tyranny of Distance is awesome.

Because the Children's Christmas Party at the end of 2015 was such a tremendous success with the Bouncy castle, The Animal Farm and the Face Painting the Management Committee decided that we should try and make the 2016 Christmas Party at least as good as last years. However, last year's party was sponsored by the company that erected our new fence and as we don't have any sponsorship for the party this year the committee agreed for me to run a 100 club – Lucky Number's Raffle.

The details have been sent out to all members and I ask everyone to help us look after the young members of our association by supporting this endeavour and hopefully helping us to sell all 100 numbers.

I have nominated again for the position of President of the GSDA of WA and have been elected unopposed for a further 12 months. I will, as always, endeavour to look after the interests of ALL our members whether their interests are in Showing, Obedience or Breeding. I am fortunate to have a

good understanding of both the show side of the club and the obedience side having been active in both for many years.

My love of the breed is what drives me to continue my involvement both as President and as an obedience instructor, which is a role that I absolutely love being part of. I will be cutting back a little during this coming term of office and I will not be joining any of the sub-committees during the next twelve months but will attend each of the sub-committees at least once during the year.

I encourage our newer members to consider getting involved in the running of the club. There are many ways that you can be involved and if you are interested but unsure how to get involved, I will be happy to speak to you and offer you help and advice. We have a very active and hard working group of members that have been volunteers for many years and we really need some of the new younger members to become involved.

Finally, as I always do, I offer my heartfelt thanks to the partners of our volunteers for their support throughout the year. Our volunteers could not put in the hard work, and time, that they do without the total support of their partners. I especially thank my wife, Dorothy, who continues to support me through the good times and the sometimes not so good times. Dorothy has always given me total support in my many roles within the club, often putting up with many evenings alone at home while I am at the club attending meetings etc. Well done everyone and once again, many, many thanks.

BREED AFFAIRS CHAIR'S REPORT

We have had a busy year in this portfolio as always the registrars will be submitting their own reports they specialise in.

Our breed affairs meetings have been informative and expansive ranging from health matters to the G.S.D.C.A. National show, Junior Handlers to Character & Working Assessments.

We have had two very interesting talks this year the first from Dr Claire Sharpe on G.D.V. (Gastric dilatation volvulus) and one on Canine Reproduction from Dr Nadine Gruenthal from the Pet Practice. The talks were well attended and those who took the time to sit, listen and contribute came away better informed.

Dr Sharpe will be returning in November to give us a talk on the topic of haemangiosarcoma – this condition is of extreme importance in our breed. I would like to thank Dr Candy Wedge, our veterinary advisor for her support in securing these talks on such topical matters.

The importance of Dr Sharpe's research has been recognised by a donation of \$5000 which has been earmarked by the G.S.D.C.A. at the 2016 A.G.M. this will fund further research and I look forward to updates on the research into G.D.V.

We managed to combine the Canine Reproduction talk with a Breeder's Forum and opportunity for members to voice their opinions on the direction the show discipline (in particular the S.B.E.) needs to focus on. 


